Central Bargaining Update

The following developments have occurred in the last few weeks:

- On October 16, 2019, ETFO filed for conciliation after bargaining talks stalled.
- > On **November 1, 2019**, ETFO announced the results of its central strike votes:
 - Teacher/Occasional Teacher Vote: 98% in favour of taking central strike action, if necessary
 - o Education Worker Vote: 98% in favour of taking central strike action, if necessary
- > On **November 4, 2019**, a conciliation meeting between ETFO, Ontario Public School Boards Association (OPSBA), Council of Trustees Association (CTA) and the government took place.
- > On **November 4, 2019**, ETFO requested a "no board" report after the conciliation meeting was unsuccessful.
- ➤ On **November 8, 2019**, ETFO received a "no board" report from the Ministry of Labour.

Locally, a special stewards meeting has been scheduled for Monday, November 18 to discuss specifics with respect to our provincial bargaining strategy. After the meeting, the next critical step will be for your steward to share the information directly with you and your ETFO colleagues during an in-school meeting to occur before the end of November. It is critical that you attend this meeting.

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United Way



Getting Ready to Retire

Thinking of retirement (5 years or earlier):

- Plan to attend a Retirement Workshop
- Apply for iAccess at https://members.otpp.com
- Get a pension estimate
- Choose a survivor benefit

At two years:

- Attend a retirement workshop
- Get a pension estimate update
- Review survivor benefits

During your last year of work:

- 1. Get a pension estimate update
- 2. Review survivor benefits
- 3. Call the ETFO office regarding LTD
- 4. Collect required documents:
- Birth certificate
- Marriage or statutory declaration of common law relationship certificate (if applicable)
- Spouse's birth certificate (if applicable)
- Separation or divorce certificate (if applicable)
- 5. Plan on attending our Benefits Open House on April 17, 2019

Terminating LTD Coverage

Although enrollment in our LTD plan is generally mandatory, there are situations in which members can and/or should cancel their LTD coverage.

To determine if you are able to cancel your LTD coverage you need to do three things:

- 1. Print off a copy of your most recent Teachers' Pension Plan statement. You can do this at https://www.otpp.com/members/my/

- 2. Print off a copy of your current absence balance. You can do this at

https://selfservice.amdsb.ca/ISESS/login.php

3. Call OTIP (1-800-267-6847) and ask them when you are able to terminate your LTD coverage. They will ask you for information which is on your pension statement and current absence balance.

You will then need to complete and submit the ETFO Provincial LTD Termination Form in order for your LTD coverage termination to be processed. You may obtain this form by emailing Kent and requesting a copy.

RETIREMENT INFORMATION

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If you are approaching retirement time, you can access your personal pension information online in a safe and secure environment. Members should register for iAccess at www.otpp.com. If you require information about retirement, please feel free to contact Kent.

In accordance with our collective agreement (article 17):

A teacher shall provide written notice by November 30 of the intention to resign or retire effective December 31.

The Board shall pay \$150.00 to each teacher who provides written notice by March 1 of the intention to terminate employment effective either June 30 or August 31.
